


## STUDENT VOICE IN ACTION: PREPARING TO PARTNER

<ul> <li>Guiding Questions:</li> <li>1. What is the situation?</li> <li>2. Why is a solution needed?</li> <li>3. Who will benefit from a solution?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Guiding Questions:</li> <li>1. Are the solutions realistic?</li> <li>2. Do the solutions take everyone's needs into account? Do they benefit the good of the whole?</li> <li>3. How do you know that you are not creating noise? What might noise in this situation look like?</li> <li>4. How will these solutions be executed?</li> <li>5. Is everyone ready and willing to take responsibility for the action plan?</li> <li>6. Who will follow up and ensure fidelity?</li> <li>7. What is "Plan B"?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Guiding Questions:</li> <li>1. Who will you tell?</li> <li>2. When will you tell them?</li> <li>3. Are you prepared to be flexible and make possible changes during the conversation? This is a partnership!</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Guiding Questions:</li> <li>1. Has the situation been resolved?</li> <li>2. Did everyone take responsibility for their role in the solution?</li> <li>3. What next steps are needed?</li> </ul>



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
